## Safety Update

In addition to following these safety laws, it is important to talk to your children about safe behavior and following safety rules when walking, biking or scootering to school. Finally, please remember that DCSD does not permit dogs on school property during school hours. This includes all sidewalks and grass areas around our perimeter.
